Description

Housing Studies have always been a fascinating and yet a complicated topic of research given its intrinsic multi-dimensions, changing contexts, regulations, and cultural backgrounds in which it is embedded. An additional layer of complexity is imposed by the fact that Housing is a highly context-dependent phenomenon, which in turn limits the scope for using evidence generated in North American and European contexts to solve or inform Latin American and Caribbean urban problems. On the other hand, and given the growing inequality in the US, American Housing issues might start resembling those of LAC countries. All together, we face a situation that demands comprehensive research of housing issues in local contexts, but at the same time a global discussion of research findings in order to better inform, make sense of the different phenomena, and assess urban policies.

- Residential mobility, segregation, and informal housing
- Impacts of housing policies
- Renting vs. Buying and its effects in labor markets
