Papers will go through the standard peer-review process. Empirical and theoretical works are welcome. All papers fitting the broad topic are welcome, in particular papers on the following economic impacts of climate change:

- Urbanization
- Agriculture
- Productivity and Structural Change
- Trade
- Migration
- Conflicts
- Poverty

The deadline for submissions is 30 November 2019. When submitting your paper, please indicate in the covering letter that the article is for the special issue, and select the special issue option in the submission system.
