

REGIONAL ECONOMIC ANALYST Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia

The Research Department of the Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia is seeking to fill the position of Regional Economic Analyst. The Regional Economic Analyst would join a team responsible for conducting applied economic research, producing over 100 public reports annually based on original data or analysis, and delivering briefings on current economic conditions and policy issues germane to the Third District and to the Federal Reserve System. Specifically, the analyst in this position will contribute to the production process and the research agenda for our Business Outlook Surveys and our coincident and leading indicators for state economies, among other projects. Generally, the position offers a stimulating opportunity for a person well-grounded in economic theory, national and regional data, econometric analysis, and survey design to contribute to the field.

The ideal candidate would have a master's degree in economics with concentrations in urban and regional or in public finance and have five (plus) years of progressively responsible experience. Relevant experience would include some combination of specific work with time series econometrics and with survey design, plus a strong familiarity with regional economic data and/or spatial analytics. This candidate would be able to demonstrate strong analytical and problem-solving skills, competent programming skills with pertinent software, e.g., EViews, R, and SAS, excellent oral and written communications skills, and the flexibility to achieve goals while working independently and on teams. Other combinations of relevant education and experience may be considered.
